His death triggered a journey that has been anything but easy and yet we are starting to see how God is deepening our faith, sharpening our vision and priorities and teaching us to depend more on Him. The Apostle Peter speaking about suffering ‘all kinds of trials’ writes *“these have come so that the proven genuineness of your faith—of greater worth than gold, which perishes even though refined by fire—may result in praise, glory and honour when Jesus Christ is revealed (1 Pet 1:7).”* Isn’t that remarkable? Our faith, which is of greater worth than gold, is also refined in the fire and in so doing is proved genuine. As we begin to emerge from the ‘refiners fire’ it’s clear that God has been teaching us much about Himself and doing much in us that will prepare us for co-labouring with Him in the years ahead!

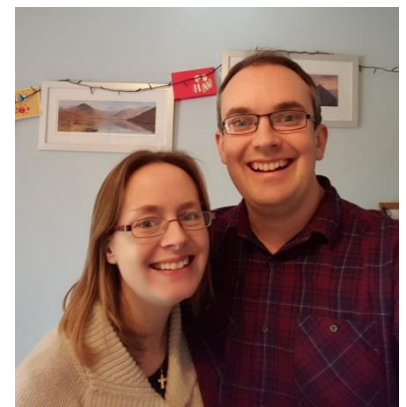
