

A vision for disciple-making...

We all have some kind of vision for the future, consciously or unconsciously. That vision relates to the things that are important to us, the things that we want to make a priority. During the past few months we have been spending some time thinking about vision and in particular how God is asking us to work out our Navigator calling amongst students on campus. The vision statement below is the result of our thoughts and prayers and is an expression of how we see that calling worked out amongst students. There is a hive of Christian activity for students in Southampton which presents a huge danger of burnout, getting stuck in a Christian bubble and potentially students not receiving the help they really need. In that context the things that God is putting on our hearts about our contribution to this mass of Christian activity are...

SHARING OUR LIVES *“Because we loved you so much, we were delighted to share with you not only the gospel of God but our lives as well” (1 Thess 2:8, NIV)* Paul’s letter to the Thessalonians is an inspirational example of disciple-making in action. Paul talks about sharing not only the gospel but also our lives and that is the very heart-beat of the ministry God has called us to. We are eager to minister to students within the context of sharing our lives together. This idea of sharing lives comes in the context of how Paul, Silas & Timothy had been like a mother (gentle, caring) and like a father (encouraging, comforting & urging them to live lives worthy of God). At the start of a new term we are so grateful for God’s goodness to us in giving us some great new students to get alongside and seek to help. Our conviction is that disciple-making is not so much about programmes but about relationships and we are so excited about encouraging these students to know, love and share Jesus Christ.

PURPOSEFUL AND INTENTIONAL *“Night and day we pray most earnestly that we may see you again and supply what is lacking in your faith” (1 Thess 3:10)* It is also clear that Paul’s approach to disciple-making was both intentional (he took the initiative) and purposeful (he was trying to fill up what was lacking in the Thessalonians faith). To that end we feel more committed than ever to encourage students to get into God’s word; to encounter Jesus together in community as we read, study, discuss and learn together.

GENERATIONAL IMPACT *“And the things you have heard me say in the presence of many witnesses entrust to reliable people who will also be qualified to teach others” (2 Timothy 2:2)* Another facet of Paul’s approach to disciple-making is that it is reproducible; the idea that we are looking to model, teach and entrust something to people that they in turn can do likewise for others and so on. We continue to be so grateful for the generation of graduates and older students that God has given us to partner with us in this ministry. Some are new to the team while others have been with us for anything up to 10 years. Part of the challenge for us is not just how do we help the students but how do we help others to help them.

CHRISTIAN COMMUNITY; We want our contribution to bless not just the NAVS student ministry but the wider body of Christ. In practice this looks different for each of us involved on the team...Steve is helping Above Bar Church with 1 to1 training and the CU with small group leader training. Please pray for good ongoing relationships with other student organisations (e.g. CU, FI) and local churches.

FAMILY; We are really enjoying doing ministry together as a family. Benjamin is a real extravert and loves it when there are students around to play with. Naomi is less keen but has still been a real blessing to the group this term. Please pray for us all that we would strike that difficult balance between family and ministry life.
