A day that changed everything...

“The Lord gave and the Lord has taken away; may the name of the Lord be praised.” Job 1:21

The 20th June 2013 will forever be a day of great sadness for us. It was the day that James Witham, one of our summer team, fell to his death in a tragic hiking accident in Norway (read more at www.navigators.co.uk/news). Many of you will know this already (esp. if you receive our regular e-mail updates) but we are conscious that some will not have heard this sad news. James was a late addition to our team but had been a consistent part of our group for the past 3 years and had just joined our student leadership team. He had become a dear friend to our whole family and was much loved by us and many others in the ministry. Many of us watched with great excitement as he grew in faith and love for the Lord during his time with us (read more about his journey of faith in the attached article written by Adam Collett about his own reflections of James’ journey). Despite the sadness of our loss we are sure you will agree that Adam’s article is very encouraging; helping people like James to meet and experience Jesus is a huge reason why we continue to give our lives to student ministry. We are grateful that the gospel is not without hope and James is now with Jesus. Please pray that we would meet many more young men women like James who we and our student team can draw alongside and train.

Many of you will also know that earlier this year we found ourselves feeling quite weary and drained from what we have now seen was an unsustainable pace of life. This backdrop for the summer exaggerated the emotional effects of going through this trauma especially for Debs. You will be pleased to read that we are doing much, much better now and we are currently managing to find a good balance in life and ministry this term. Debs has in fact stepped back significantly from ministry and while Steve is still leading the student ministry he has handed over a number of his regular activities and responsibilities. Thank you so much to all those who have written to us and prayed for us; it has meant so much to know that we have so many people supporting us through this. We are still looking to God for our future and will have more to share in coming newsletters about how the Lord is reshaping our contribution in ministry.

Another significant day was 5th Sept 1993, 20 years ago. That was the day that Steve, aged 14, became a Christian during his time at the Independent Chapel, Spicer Street, St Albans. We are grateful for how the Lord called Steve that evening after a talk at church on Isaiah 5. Steve still has a letter from Peter Secombe (his former pastor who actually gave the talk) who wrote to encourage him in the faith. Twenty years on from that day both I (Steve) and Debs are thrilled to continue having opportunities to be involved in the lives of students like James and see their lives similarly transformed by the gospel.
