## A time to reflect...

<sup>28</sup>Do you not know? Have you not heard? The Lorid is the everlasting God, the Creator of the ends of the earth. He will not grow tired or weary, and his understanding no one can fathom.<sup>29</sup>He gives strength to the weary and increases the power of the weak. <sup>30</sup>Even youths grow tired and weary, and young men stumble and fall; <sup>31</sup>but those who hope in the LORD will renew their strength. They will soar on wings like eagles; they will run and not grow weary, they will walk and not be faint. Isaiah 40:28-31

For any who may not be familiar with our story so far, it goes as follows: Steve studied in Southampton from 1997-2000 before doing the Connect Programme. Debs studied in Cardiff 1999-2002 and we go to know one another at a Navigator conference in Moffat, Scotland in the summer of 2000. Debs moved to Southampton in 2001 to do the Connect programme and we have been ministering here amongst students ever since. After Connect Steve worked for 6 years in Salisbury for a Financial Services company while Debs studied for a second degree in Occupational Therapy part-time while continuing her role with the Navigators. We married at Above Bar church in Southampton in March 2005 and then in 2007-2008 we went through a process of much change. Debs graduated and started a job as an occupational therapist in September and then we moved to our current house a month later. A few months later in January 2008 Steve left his job in Salisbury to start working full-time for the Navigators and when Benjamin arrived at the end of 2008 Debs finished her job as well.

It is hard to believe that we've been leading the student ministry in Southampton for 7 years. Steve has been working full-time for the NAVS for 5 years while Debs been part-time with the NAVS for 10 years now. Those who see us regularly or know us well will know just how much we can relate to the verses above. Student ministry is very intense and it is very draining emotionally, spiritually and physically. Balancing the needs of three young and growing children with all that needs be done in the student ministry has been particularly challenging over the past few years. Hence we've decided to spend some extended time away to have something of a minisabbatical this summer. A few years ago we became part of a charitable organisation that owns a youth hostel in Skjolden, Norway and we have been offered the opportunity to stay from the beginning of June until our annual Reps Conference at the end of August. We plan to use this time for some rest and relaxation, to reflect back over the past 7 years in Southampton, to seek God about how He would have us best serve Him going forward. We will also consider how we can best use our time in a way that is sustainable in the longer term. This time will sandwich our annual mission experience to Norway & Latvia (see attached). Please pray for us that the LORD would renew our both our strength and our sense of vision as we put our hope in Him.
