Growing faith...

¹Therefore, since we are surrounded by such a great cloud of witnesses, let us throw off everything that hinders and the sin that so easily entangles. And let us run with perseverance the race marked out for us, ²fixing our eyes on Jesus, the pioneer and perfecter of faith. For the joy set before him he endured the cross, scorning its shame, and sat down at the right hand of the throne of God. ³Consider him who endured such opposition from sinners, so that you will not grow weary and lose heart. **Hebrews 12:1-3**

At our weekend away this term Steve spoke on the theme of "Faith in Action" and we journeyed together through Hebrews 11:1-12:3. We thought about the nature of faith (what faith is and what it believes), misplaced faith (considering the idols in which we place our trust) and finally the substance of faith (how faith is worked out in practice). The final section of this passage (12:1-3) is something of a summary and the readers of Hebrews are urged to remember the heroes of faith and to run with perseverance the race marked out for us, fixing our eyes on Jesus. As we draw close to Christmas we have been encouraged again to consider Jesus. For a moment just imagine yourself in Jesus' shoes and ask yourself what did Jesus see? Before Him lay sleeping friends, betrayal, angry mobs, violent soldiers, a weak Governor, lashings and beatings, corrupt leaders and a hammer driving nails into a cruel Roman cross. What was to be seen was completely shameful and hopeless. Yet we're told that Jesus had a joy set before Him; the hope of resurrection, the joy of saving countless millions, of revealing the wonder of God and bringing glory to Him. You see even when the 'things that are seen' seem to be against us we are called to live by faith. We are to fix our eyes on Jesus so that we will not grow weary and lose heart. This is why all of those mentioned in Hebrews 11 were commended for their faith.

Our Thursday Bible study groups have been studying the life of Moses and we have seen how God working in out-of-the-ordinary ways did not necessarily lead to faith. After the Exodus the people soon forget God and what He had done for them and while Moses is receiving the Ten Commandments at Sinai (where God caused mountains to tremble and appeared in pillars of cloud) the people of Israel were at the foot of the mountain building a golden calf to bow down to. So we have learned that firstly "what we see" does not necessarily produce faith and secondly that "the seen" is no more real that the "unseen". Paul writes that we walk by faith and not by sight. Please join us in praying for the students to develop a deep, genuine and lasting faith in Jesus; a faith Hebrews defines as "confidence in what we hope for and assurance about what we do not see." (11:1)
