His Grace is enough ... abounding grace

Reflections on the last term - "But he [God] said to me, "My grace is sufficient for you, for my power is made perfect in weakness." 2 Corinthians 12:9

This past term we have been working through some Bible studies loosely based on Jerry Bridges book *Transforming Grace* (NAVPRESS) with our Thursday evening Bible study groups. We have talked about why we so desperately need grace and just how amazing grace really is; grace as a motivator and how it ties in with the ideas of freedom, law and obedience; and finally the sufficiency of grace and our need to respond to and appropriate God's grace. These studies have been hugely helpful as we have attempted to get our heads around what is a very deep and complex concept. Personally it has helped us to appreciate God's grace firstly as *unmerited favour* and secondly as *divine assistance* through His Spirit.

It seems like so much of the way that we go about living our lives hinges on how we understand this significant and extraordinary concept. Do we believe that God loves us, values and accepts us because of His grace alone and not because of any merit on our part? Do we believe that His grace really is enough for our weakness, our inadequacy and our unworthiness? It has been exciting to think deeply on questions like these and see time and time again that God's grace is more than enough; not only in salvation but in every aspect of our daily lives. Throughout all of the pressures, challenges and opportunities of this past term we can testify that God's grace has been enough. We continue to enjoy being involved with student ministry (which in itself is a gift of God's grace) and have the opportunity to use the gifts that God has given us for the building up of His Kingdom.
