We are conscious that there are still struggles (the ups and the downs) and there will be for some time. Time and time again in Scripture God uses weakness to display His power and Paul's 2nd letter to the Corinthians makes this quite clear. We are approaching the term ahead with open hands, much flexibility and a great team of people working with us on the pitch AND on the bench supporting us. Please pray that God's power would be displayed through our lives and ministry this year as we live and serve Him here in Southampton. In 2 Corinthians 1 Paul writes about the troubles they experienced in the Province of Asia when they were under great pressure and despaired of life itself. Then he says "But this happened that we might not rely on ourselves but on God, who raises the dead" (v9). Please pray that God would use all that we have been through over these past couple of years to cause us to rely more on Him. Pray too that we would minister to and serve those God is giving us in the student ministry out of an overflow of this dependence and delight in Jesus Christ. Surely God's grace has and always will be sufficient for us in everything that life brings. Jesus is enough and despite the challenges, true fulfilment and satisfaction is found in Him alone.











## Working with Students again...

With Fresher's now upon us we are gearing up for two of our biggest opportunities to meet new people; firstly the Clubs & Societies Bunfight (Wed 23 Sep) and then our Welcome BBQ (Thurs 24 Sep). Please pray that God would lead us to many students in whose hearts He is at work and in whom God would have us play a part in helping them to (a) be wholehearted disciples of Jesus and (b) be lifelong labourers in His Harvest. To this end we have structured the ministry differently this year and will have a series of larger group meetings at which we will be talking about what it means to be a disciple and what it means to be a labourer/worker (see attached Events flier). On the alternate weeks we will be meeting in close-nit small groups to study the Bible together and be accountable to one another. We see the former as a platform to train and equip students to be fruitful on campus and the latter as a platform for growth which will enable our leadership team to take growing responsibility with the people we are involved with. We would love to see small evangelistic groups springing up to study the Bible with not-yet Christians - the concept of IGNITE will now become a platform to see this happen more relationally amongst and (if appropriate) alongside the students.
