## Finding Freedom: Jesus' Resurrection

"There exists such overwhelming evidence, positive and negative, factual and circumstantial, that no intelligent jury in the world could fail to bring in a verdict that the resurrection story is true." *Lord Darling (former Chief Justice 1914-1918)* 

This past term with the students we have been considering the question of Freedom. The world around us tells us that freedom is about doing and saying whatever you want without limit or boundaries. Yet if we are honest we see that such boundaries are necessary. To make this point, Tim Keller cites the examples of the fish (who would not survive outside of its natural habitat of water) and love (the ultimate loss of freedom for the sake of another). Healthy boundaries are part of God's plan and purpose for our lives. God's big story shows us how God made us free but we rejected God's boundaries at the Fall and became slaves to our sin, to our natural inclination to live our way without reference to God. What was supposed to be a choice to be free actually led to becoming enslaved! God however had a plan to set us free from that sin, a plan which has been on God's heart since before creation to send His Son to pay the price of our freedom. Approximately 2000 years ago Jesus died a cruel death on our behalf but that is not the end of the story. On that first Easter morning two women went to the tomb to anoint Jesus' body with spices. Upon their arrival they found the stone was rolled away, the tomb empty and they were told that Jesus had risen from the dead. Whatever we conclude about what happened that day almost all scholars agree on three things: first, the tomb was empty; second, the disciple's believed that they encountered the risen Jesus; and third, these events had a significant impact on the early church. As the quote above suggests, the evidence for the resurrection of Jesus (and indeed for the accounts that record it) is overwhelming. What you make of this evidence?

Paul, in 1 Corinthians 15, spends time examining the evidence and the implications (if true) of the resurrection of Jesus Christ. If He did not rise from the dead then there is no hope for us; nor will we rise from the dead, and our faith is also futile. Our hope is built upon the fact that Jesus did rise from the dead and that one day we too will be resurrected, one day we will be truly free when we will be like Jesus. There will be no more sin, no more pain and no more death. Peter describes this hope as a 'living hope' not just because Jesus lives but because by God's grace we also live and look forward to all that God has in store for us. Easter is a huge reminder of the hope we have because of all that Jesus has accomplished for us. Let's celebrate the Cross and the Resurrection this Easter.
