Wholehearted Disciples...

"You know what the Lord said to Moses the man of God at Kadesh Barnea about you and me. I was forty years old when Moses the servant of the LORD sent me from Kadesh Barnea to explore the land. And I brought him back a report according to my convictions, but my fellow Israelites who went up with me made the hearts of the people melt in fear. I, however, followed the LORD my God wholeheartedly." *Joshua 14:6b-9*

Last week, Steve was back in Norway to attend the thanksgiving service for our dear friend, Brit Bolstad who went to be with Jesus last month. The day was particularly striking because it clearly testified to how she had followed Jesus wholeheartedly throughout her life. The same of course might be said of the late Queen Elizbeth II who also passed away this Autumn. Both funerals got us thinking about the theme of wholeheartedness in the Bible and there are plenty of good examples of those who did, and didn't, follow God wholeheartedly!

First a negative example! Solomon at the dedication of the temple in 1 Kings 8 praises God for His faithfulness in keeping His promises to his father David. These promises were part of God's covenant with His people – a covenant that Solomon says required the people's wholehearted obedience to God. However, Solomon himself was not someone who could be described as having served God wholeheartedly throughout his life. Sure, he started well enough, but in time he was led astray by the accumulation of wives, wealth and horses just as God had warned would happen in Deuteronomy 17:14-20. Starting well it seems does not guarantee that we will finish well!

However, there are also many in the Bible who we might describe as having been wholehearted in following God. Caleb is explicitly described in this manner. He was one of the twelve spies that Moses sent to explore the land of Canaan (Numbers 13-14). He and Joshua brought back a positive and favourable report of the land and they urged the people to go forth and take possession of it. The report was honest about what they were up against, but they were also expectant that God would deliver them. But they were outvoted by the remaining spies who had come back feeling afraid and inadequate by the task that lay ahead of them. As a result, the people of God spent the next 40 years in the wilderness! Forty-five years later only Caleb and Joshua enter the promised land and Caleb (aged 85) reflects to Joshua about how he had followed the LORD His God wholeheartedly (Joshua 14:9). God had promised him the hill country of Hebron and Joshua is only too willing to make good on this promise. Caleb wholeheartedly and passionately followed the Lord, not only for a period, but over a lifetime.

As we reflect once more on the birth of our Saviour, Jesus Christ let us also reflect on the challenge presented by the wholeheartedness display by Caleb. 1 Timothy 4:7, Hebrews 12:1-3 and 1 Cor 15:58 all speak passionately about the kind of characteristics required to walk wholeheartedly with God over the whole of our lives.
