Biblical Framework for Worship Worshipping in Spirit and Truth

²¹"Woman," Jesus replied, "believe me, a time is coming when you will worship the Father neither on this mountain nor in Jerusalem. ²²You Samaritans worship what you do not know; we worship what we do know, for salvation is from the Jews. ²³Yet a time is coming and has now come when the true worshipers will worship the Father in the Spirit and in truth, for they are the kind of worshipers the Father seeks. ²⁴God is spirit, and his worshipers must worship in the Spirit and in truth."

John 4:21-24

Worshipping in Spirit and Truth

Spirit = God's Presence Truth = God's Word

In the Old Testament: Presence = Ark of the Covenant Word = 10 Commandments

> In the New Testament: Presence = Holy Spirit Word = Jesus

New Testament Worship

"In view of God's Mercy, offer your bodies as living sacrifices, holy and pleasing to God. This is your spiritual act of Worship." Romans 12:1

"Speak to one another with Psalms, hymns and songs from the Spirit" Ephesians 5:19

"Let the **word of Christ** dwell in you richly; teach and admonish one another in all wisdom; and **with gratitude** in your hearts **sing psalms, hymns, and spiritual songs** to God."

Colossians 3:16

Worship in the Psalms

"Praise the Lord. Praise God in his sanctuary; praise him in his mighty heavens. ²Praise him for his acts of power; praise him for his surpassing greatness. ³Praise him with the sounding of the trumpet, praise him with the harp and lyre, ⁴ praise him with timbrel and dancing, praise him with the strings and *pipe*, ⁵*praise him with the clash of* cymbals, praise him with resounding cymbals. ⁶Let everything that has breath praise the Lord. Praise the Lord."

How Valuable is the One I Love? **Example from Jesus' Parables:** ⁴⁴ "The kingdom of heaven is like treasure hidden in a field. When a man found it, he hid it again, and then in his joy went and sold all he had and **bought that field**. ⁴⁵ "Again, the kingdom of heaven is like a merchant looking for fine pearls. ⁴⁶When he found **one of great value**, he went away and sold everything he had and bought it."

The Challenge of Idols An Encounter with Jesus

"²¹Jesus answered, "If you want to be perfect, go, sell your possessions and give to the poor, and you will have treasure in heaven.
